NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON COMPREHENSIVE PLAN REVISIONS

The Planning Commission of the Town of Bone Lake, Polk County, Wisconsin, will be conducting a public hearing to discuss the updated revisions to the Comprehensive Plan which they have been developing for the last six months. The public hearing will be held on Tuesday, October 22, 2019, at 6pm, at the Bone Lake Lutheran Church. Citizen comments will be heard and discussed and recommendations will be considered by the Commission before presenting a final draft to the Town Board. The Town Board will then decide on the acceptance and approval of the updated Plan at a future meeting. The Comprehensive Plan has 10 elements: Issues & Opportunities; Housing; Transportation; Utilities & Community Facilities; Agricultural, Natural and Cultural Resources; Economic Development; Inter-Governmental Cooperation; Land Use; Implementation; and, Sustainability. Each of these elements was reviewed by the Planning Commission and compared to the original plan, with revisions made to update from 2009 to 2019. All meetings of the Planning Commission have been open and available to the public. The primary goals of the Comprehensive Plan Commission members have been for the Town of Bone Lake to remain a rural town and to encourage citizen involvement regarding major land use proposals.
