

The Ice Age National Scenic Trail is a 1,200 mile footpath that crosses the entire state of WI. 15.5 miles follow the Gandy Dancer State Trail starting south of Centuria at 160th Street to the tunnel south of Frederic.

ABOUT THE TRAIL

The Gandy Dancer State Trail is located 60 miles NE of the Twin Cities in northwestern Wisconsin. The Gandy Dancer connects the communities of St. Croix Falls, Centuria, Milltown, Luck, Frederic, Lewis, Siren, Webster and Danbury. Located on a former railroad corridor, the trail is generally level and wheelchair accessible.

The Gandy Dancer offers 47 miles of high quality, hard packed crushed limestone for non-motorized activities. People love to hike, run, geocache, set personal goals and train for events. Many use it for daily bike rides, work commutes and walking. The trail is dog-friendly, but please pick up after your pets and keep them on an 8 foot leash or shorter.

The trail is one of the area's finest amenities and is host to more than 30 events and activities. Friends of Gandy Dancer invite you to come travel this safe, well maintained corridor and stay awhile. You can look for birds, bears, mushrooms and wildflowers while enjoying the woods, water, fields, tunnels and picturesque bridges.

The rural communities along the trail provide sites of interest and many services. Lodging, campgrounds, restaurants, ice cream shops, breweries, museums and art galleries can be found in many of the trail towns. There are several bike repair stations along the way and a full service bike shop in Webster.

The trail is named for the work crews who laid the railroad tracks. The crews used tools made by the Gandy Tool Company of Chicago. The crews were known to work by keeping their voices and the movement of their feet and tools in harmony. This manner of work led the crews to become known as "Gandy Dancers". You may still hear these rhythms under foot or bike tire as you take in the serenity of the Gandy Dancer State Trail.
